If your car was an icecream flavor which flavor would it be? Twinkie flavored if that were a thing. Twinkie 100%i


What is the furthest trip you have taken with this car and did you have any issues while doing so?



The video I watched at work which was about how the organizer decided to start the show and details about it. The show is based off the one in Austria but is held in the small town in the mountains of Georgia.





I was talked into going from my friend that lives in Georgia and he booked a place for us to stay last minute which turned out to be a decent place. Shout out to the Rodeway Inn. I had to be back in PA by 3:30 pm and according to math my math I could swing it if I didn't fuck around. At 11pm on Thursday before the weekend of the show I called the call off sick line from my desk phone at work saying I got food poisoning and couldn't make it in Friday. "Deals Gap is a popular and internationally famous destination for driving enthusiasts of motorcycles and sports cars), as it is located along a stretch of two-lane road known as "The Dragon" since 1981. [2] The 11-mile stretch of the Dragon in Tennessee is said to have 318 curves. Some of the Dragon's sharpest curves have names like Copperhead Corner, Hog Pen Bend, Wheelie Hell, Shade Tree Corner, Mud Corner, Sunset Comer, Gravity Cavity, Beginner's End, and Brake or Bust Bend. The road earned its name from its curves being said to resemble a dragon's tail. The stretch bears the street name "Tapoco Road" in North Carolina and "Calderwood Highway" in Tennessee and is signed entirely by U.S. 129. State Route 115 is included on maps, and is the name used by Tennessee Department of Transportation for highway contracts. Since part of the road is also the southwestem border of the Great Smoky Mountains National Park, there is no development along the 11-mile stretch, resulting in no danger of vehicles pulling out in front of those in the right of way. It mostly travels through forested area and there are a few scenic overlooks and pull-off points along the route." (wikipedia.com)
