
Have you ever been recognized from the website and had crazy fans yell at you in person?


I have met some people that know me from online but I have yet to be yelled at/ assaulted by a crazed fan, that is unless you count girls from college or around home haha.

What is the furthest trip you have taken with this car and did you have any issues while doing so?



What is the furthest trip you have taken with this car and did you have any issues while doing so?



Anything else you wish to share?



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



ODUBINE TO SERVING



LUMBER JETTA

If you have been on the internet for a while you probably have seen the image of a 1997 Memory Red Jetta GT stacked with lots of wood planks. They are tied down by twine as well as concrete inside the car in the backseat. The car is running and rear bumper is dragging on the ground. The following is an email that was collected with the original information about lumberjetta from 2000. (listed on snopes.com)

"The stupidity of some people in this world never fails to amaze me. This attached picture is real - not doctored in any - way - and was taken last week in Waldorf, MD by a Transportation Supervisor for a company that delivers building materials for 84 Lumber. When he saw it there in the parking lot of IHOP, he went and bought a camera to take pictures. The car is still running as can be witnessed by the exhaust. A woman is either asleep or otherwise out in the front seat passenger side. The guy driving it was over jogging up and down on Rt. 925 in the background. The witnesses said their physical state was OTHER than normal and the police just shook their heads in amazement. The driver finally came back after the police were there and was getting down at the back to cut the twine around the load. They told him to get back until it was taken off. The materials were loaded at Home Depot. The Home Depot store manager made the customer sign a waiver before loading. Both back tires are trashed. The back shocks were driven up through the floorboard. On the roof are many 2X4s, 4X4s and OSL sheets of lumber. The load isn't all that meets the eye either. In the back seat were ten 80-pound bags of concrete! They estimated the load weight at 3000 lbs. The car is a VW Jetta with FL plates and the guy said he was headed for Annapolis!"



This item is a good example of the pitfalls of allowing pure skepticism to overwhelm ordinary evidence. After we originally put this picture and story up with an "Undetermined" status back in December 2000, we received plenty of mail from self-proclaimed digital photo "experts" offering numerous reasons (both physical and digital) why the picture couldn't possibly be real. Then we starting hearing from people who were in Waldorf that day (including employees of the Home Depot store where the building materials were purchased and the IHoP restaurant seen in the background of the photo) and actually saw the car. Then we started finding news stories about the "lumber car," including one from an enterprising reporter who tracked the hapless couple down through their license plates. He wasn't able to elicit any edifying information from them, but his story was accompanied by even more photographs, including a close-up of the snoozing woman in the passenger's seat.

The story of lumber car was recently put to the test.

The show on the Discovery Channel called MythBusters uses elements of the sceintific method to test the validity of rumors, and myths. I do not have the exact air date of the show this episode specifically, but the video was added to the website on November 21, 2011. In this episode they spun the wheel of "Mythfortune" which contained various plastic boxes of ideas sent in by the viewers. After spinning it the wheel stopped on a box filled with an image of the lumber jetta. Long story short they found the jetta able to be driven with the load on top of the car, and myth was confirmed. "CarMD is the only complete system that saves you money on your vehicle's health and maintenance decisions."

You can buy the CarMD vehicle health system on their website carmd.com as a single pay for \$119.85 or 34.95 3-pay plan. Inside the box it contains the CarMD handlheld device, quick reference user's guide, CD (contains software, demo video, help documents), USB cable, 2 AAA batteries and a storage pouch. The software will install and run on any os newer then Windows XP, or Mac OSX 10.4.4.



The software was pretty straight forward installing but was kind of useless because from the software it would redirect you to there website to login and actually see what any of the codes you scanned were. I scanned my mk3 and got what I already knew was wrong but this tool had no way to clear out the codes. So with that this is really no use to me as I can just go to jiffy lube or any place that can scan your car for free and they will clear out codes as well. This product does not save me any time.

If you need something that can scan your obd2 car then this is a product that can do so. I would not say its the best inplementation of it though. You can pick up similiar cables and whatnot on ebay for cheaper. You are also limited to 3 cars that you have to enter the vin number on the website. You have to upgrade to a premium plan if you have more than 3 cars you need to scan. I would say fuck this and pay the extra money and get a Vagcom which can pretty much do anything. This is advertised on informercials, that pretty much makes it a scam right there. \bigcirc
